

NIAF INKS PARTNERSHIP WITH CANADIAN GROUP

The National Italian American Foundation and the National Federation of Canadian Italian Business and Professional Associations signed a protocol of cooperation at the Italian consulate in New York in April. Inked by NIAF Chairman Bob Carlucci and CIBPA-NF President Gianni Leonetti, the agreement commits the organizations to a series of joint initiatives over the next three years. Key areas of collaboration include facilitating the citizenship process for Italian Americans and Italian Canadians; promoting "roots tourism" travel to Italy; organizing academic and cultural exchanges between Italy, the U.S. and Canada; and cross-promoting the accomplishments of notable Italian Americans and Italian Canadians.
